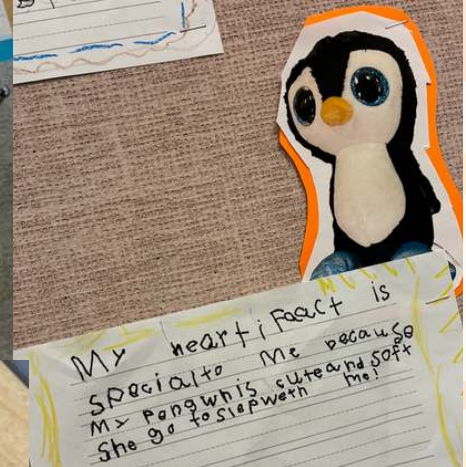
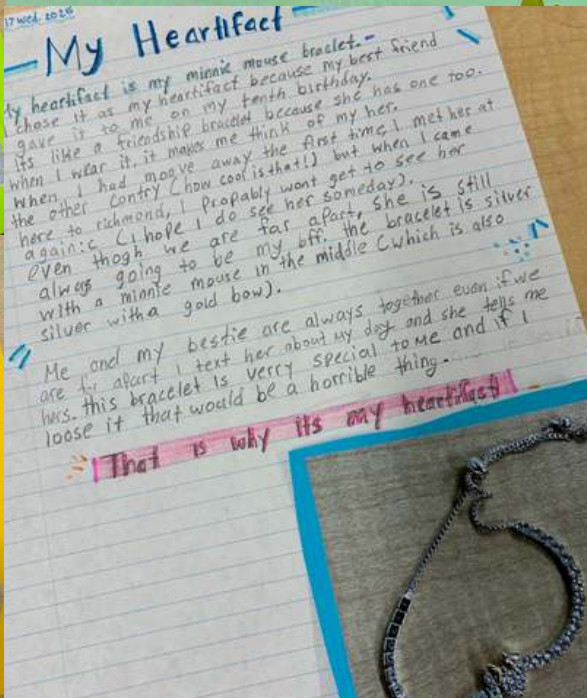

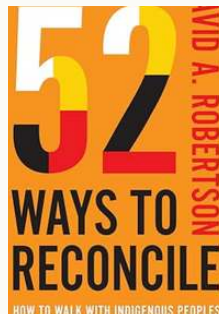


September 29 Orange Shirt Day

School Supplies and Student Agendas

The Board of School Trustees has approved the Schools Supplies Service Program for 2025-2026. The cost to each student is \$35. The School Board continues to offer this service as a cost saving support to families and it is also as a way of standardizing basic supplies for classroom use.

Exercise books, duo tangs, papers, pencils, pens, crayons, rulers, erasers, glue etc. are supplied in quantities appropriate to each grade. In the meantime, students will be given all the school supplies they need for the first six weeks of the school year. Payment is set up through our school cash online program.

Students in Divisions 1 -7 and Divisions 9-13 are expected to use a daily planner. The school provides planners at a cost of \$7.00. We hope that you take advantage of this excellent organizational tool.

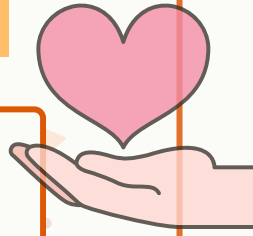


Student Family Affordability

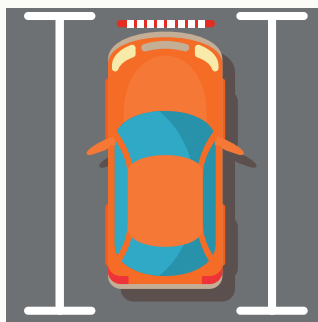
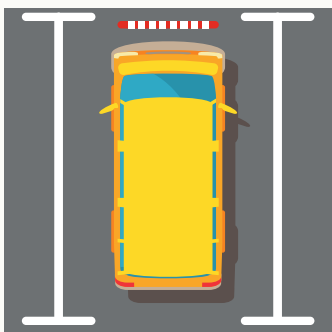

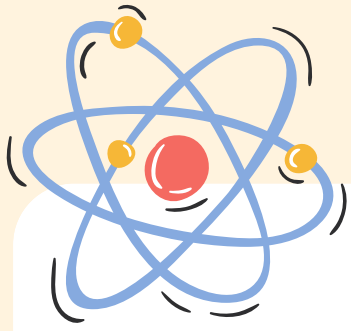


The EarlyWarning program requires parents to call the school and leave a message at 604-668-6275 option 1 if students are absent.

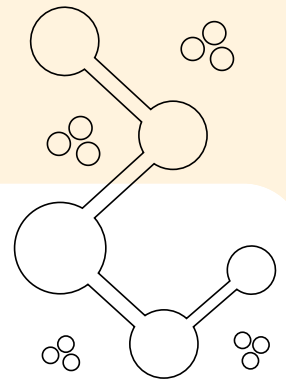

In this workshop parents will learn:

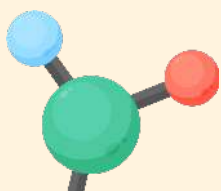
- Why we need to talk to children about sexual health at a young age

- What will be covered in Body Science workshops for students

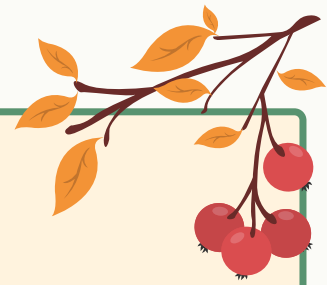
