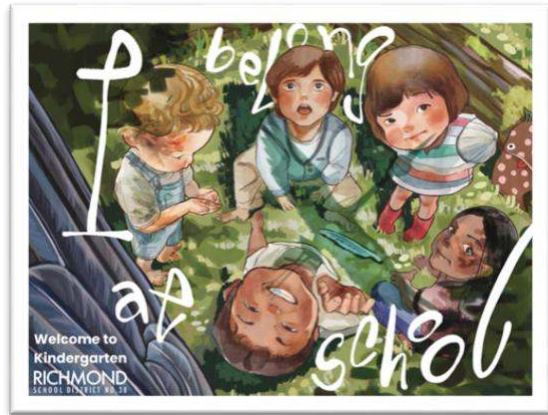


Welcome to Kindergarten!
