## 5. Administrative Report

- School clubs and teams update-track attack is underway despite the rainy weather. Talmey's Track meetdate is Thurs. May $3^{\text {rd }}$. (first rain out date is May $4^{\text {th }}$ _ just in case)
- Staff update-4 UBC teacher candidates are at Talmey until June.
- MacNeill transition for gr. 7's has started
- Outdoor Education update—Seymour trip—it got rained out- mountain cancelled \& rescheduled for the following Monday. Snow shoeing \&tobogganing were enjoyed by the gr. 6 \& 7 students. Thanks to the parent volunteers who helped out for the day.
- Tomsett registration is now closed, which means their catchment is now ours. Looking at close to 50 Kindies for next year. Moving forward we look to grow between 2 to 3 classes. As well as the unknown that trickles in during the summer. Future expansion project is now slated earlier. Overall we still have declining enrollment in the district, but Talmey is in a growth area. (worth noting: when school population increases over 200-250 we get increased resources ELL, Library time etc.) We can accommodate 315 students max. in the building in its current state
- Update on PAC sponsored bookings: Cycle BC-was full\& therefore will happen next year. Al is still trying to get in touch with Inline skating people to confirm this year's date.
- Staff Enhancement/Wish list for 2018/19 : Continuation with fine arts funding, replacing Gym Wall Mats (\$3500), Yoga (schoolwide), field-trip allotment per student


## 6. School Planning Council Report

- School wide goal for 2017-2018: Working within the Core Competencies of Communication and Personal Awareness \& Responsibility we are utilizing the concepts of Growth Mind Set and Mindfulness training for students and staff to enhance the resiliency of students in dealing with anxiety and school connections.

## 7. Committee Reports

1. Fruit and Vegetable-Mini cucumbers were served on April 10 th \& 2 dates remain for May (Mini Peppers \& Grape Tomatoes)
2. Hot lunch and Snack Shack—changes are slated for 2018/19. Thanks to Jana \& Julia for taking on the role of coordinators. They are currently investigating the logistics of the "Munch-a-Lunch" online ordering/ organization program. There is a cost for utilizing the program, but potential benefits are time/ energy saved. Switching to an online system would be a big change and would likely result in an initial decrease in orders/revenue temporarily until people fully embraced the change. Possibly we could commit less funds in other areas (ie. fine arts performances) or use some of our savings to offset some of the potential decreased revenue that might initially occur.
*Snack Shacks raised over $\$ 200$ last week-a new record!!. Long line-ups were a concern as well as limited time to eat lunch (due to line-ups). Some problem solving may need to take place to figure out future logistics of dealing with a rapidly growing school population. ${ }^{* *}$ Also mentioned was a goal of phasing out water bottle sales and instead encourage students to use re-usable water bottles \& the filling station).
3. Popcorn—next sale -tomorrow April 17th. 100 bags were sold at the last sale—another record. Some discussion took place around the possibility of a new popcorn machine (a bigger/faster model) to deal with the demands of a growing student population. Melissa will investigate potential costs \& will report back.
4. Fundraising -family photo night will be looked at as a possibility for next year.

Cash 4 clothes-New Instructions will be sent home with bags (ie. Only clothes in bags, shoes in a separate/smaller bag so the small bags can be compiled. Housewares etc. need to be packed in boxes)
5. Yearbook-Orders/final payments are coming in. 24 page format will be expanded to 28 pages with Grade 7 s doing fundraising to pay the extra $\$ 109$ for a 4 page "Grad Zone". Final numbers will officially be submitted May15th. Have no skating photos if people could check \& send to Kristen.
