From our Principal

#### **Emergency & Inclement Weather**

#### **General Information**

During an emergency, the district's first priority is to ensure student and staff safety. We work closely with local municipalities and emergency services to assess the situation, gather accurate information, and implement emergency safety protocols.

#### **Inclement Weather**

The district will try to determine school **closures** due to inclement weather by 6:30 a.m. Updates will be delivered using social media and school and district websites. No radio or television announcement will be made saying that schools are open. Only school **closures** will be announced by the media. To reach as many people as possible - as quickly as possible - we work closely with our local media to share information. Listen to local radio stations and follow local news outlets online to also get information about the impact of severe weather or emergencies in our schools.

- If snowfall begins while school is in session, in most circumstances, schools will remain OPEN until the end of the school day.
- If schools are open, and you wish to keep your child home due to weather conditions, you may do so. Please let your school know of this decision.

Parents/guardians are responsible for their child's safe travel to school. If possible, we encourage parents to walk their children to school in poor weather conditions.

#### **Parking Lot Safety**

The parking only gets congested twice a day, and only for a few minutes in the morning and at 2:45pm. However in consulting with the RCMP they do remind us all not to double park or block access for cars as you may be dropping or picking up your children. If there are no parking spaces available please do not double park! Exit the parking lot and park along the side streets that allow for parking, while abiding by the No Stopping regulations in front of the school. Which will be enforced by By-Law Officers and the RCMP. Again, this is for the safety of all members of our learning community.

This year, as per the Ministry of Education's directive, we continue to utilize the students' ePortfolio to Communicate Student Learning. Like last year, students, will have their term assessments uploaded to their ePortfolio by the classroom teacher. Division 6, Ms. Hosta and Division 9, Ms. Molnar and Ms. Silverson are utilizing Option B for this year, and students will receive paper copies of Report Cards by Wednesday, December 15th. However, they too will upload a Proficiency Scale assessment to their students' ePortfolios later this year and in the third term. All teachers have sent out the link for parents to sign up for the Parent Portal to view the Proficiency Scale assessment of the

Core Competencies for their child. This is but one of the methods to communicate and provide information for the parent and child. If at any time a parent has a question about their child's progress, they can contact the teacher via email or by phoning the office. The reports follow B.C. Ministry of Education requirements for reporting to parents and guardians. The report cards are intended to:

- communicate clearly and concisely
- support student motivation and learning
- enhance communication with parents

# Mandatory Daily Health Declaration Process for Staff and Students

#### Ask yourself the following:

1.	Key Symptoms of Illness:	Do you have any of the following <u>NEW Key Symptoms of Illness</u> ?	
		<ul> <li>Fever</li> <li>Chills</li> <li>Cough or worsening of chronic cough</li> <li>Shortness of breath</li> <li>Diarrhea</li> <li>Nausea and vomiting</li> <li>Loss of sense of smell or taste</li> </ul>	
2.	International Travel:	Have you returned from travel outside of Canada in the last 14 days?	
3.	Confirmed Contact:	Are you a confirmed contact of a person confirmed to have COVID-19?	

Answering YES to any of the questions will prevent the staff/student from entering the school or worksite effective immediately.
