OPTIONAL STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE PLAN

As in previous years, families can choose to purchase an optional student accident insurance plan for their children through the "InsureMyKids[®]" program, underwritten by Old Republic Insurance Company of Canada. The "InsureMyKids[®]" accident insurance program offers protection against the potentially high costs of any injury resulting from unexpected accidents and is especially valuable for families who:

 do not have medical or dental plans, have limited plans, as it may help supplement health and dental benefits, or have active children who enjoy sports and outdoor activities.

The insurance agreement will be between the family and Old Republic Canada and will be effective on the date the enrollment application and payment are received by the insurance carrier. The program coverage typically includes:
