Welcome to Autumn

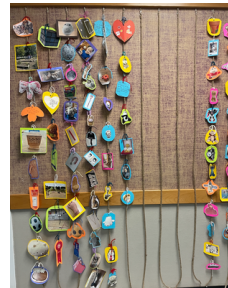

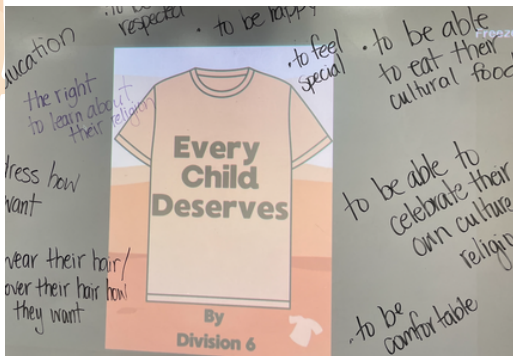

Learning Highlights

(Fragaria chiloensis)

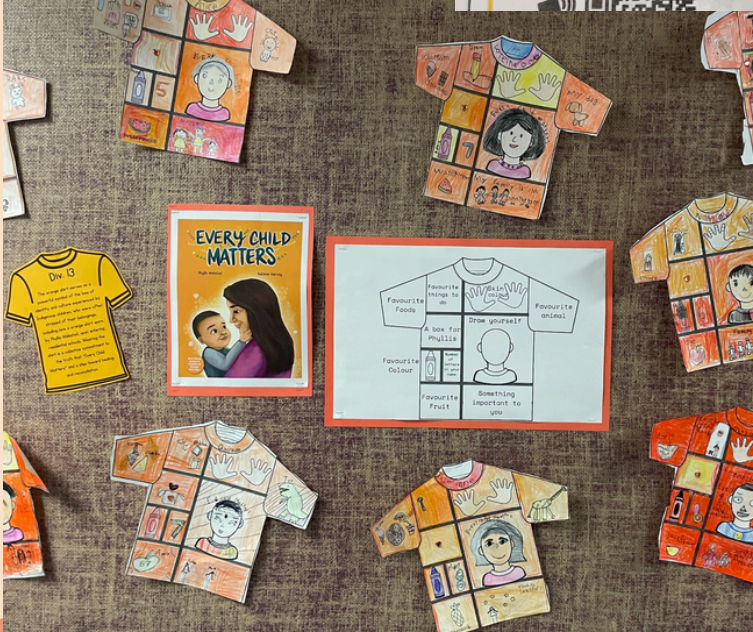
Hul'q'umi'num: stsi'yu	Skwxwú7mesh: schi7iáý (sch-eh-eh-eye)

Strawberry leaves make a vitamin-C rich tea. Use leaves fresh or dried (wilted leaves release hydrogen cyanide). Wild berries are small (1-3.5 cm) but nutritious. Grows from Alaska to California on sand dunes and coastal bluffs.

Yarrow

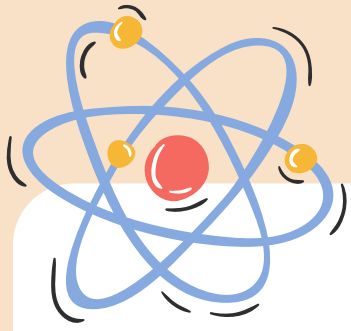
(Achillea millefolium)

Hul'q'umi'num: t'uliqw'ulhp	Skwxwú7mesh: si7semáchxw (say-sem-ah-eh-xw)

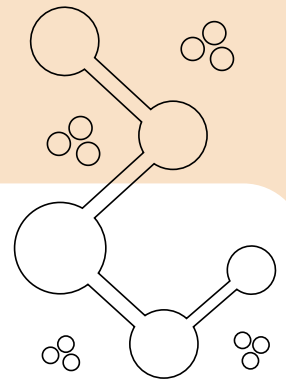

In this workshop parents will learn:

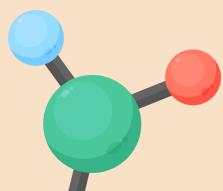
- Why we need to talk to children about sexual health at a young age

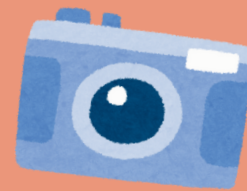

FOUNDATION SKILLS ASSESSMENT

Each year students in Grades 4 and 7 participate in the Foundation Skills Assessment. The assessment consists of a written and online component. Students are assessed in literacy and numeracy. The assessment provides a snapshot of student learning currently, and provides the school with information about strengths and stretches in these areas. The assessment results are not used to determine written update comments but do provide families with another opportunity to see how their child is doing. The best source of information, however, continues to be your child's classroom teacher.

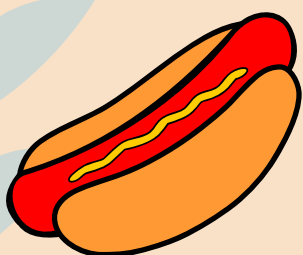


PAC Meeting and Information

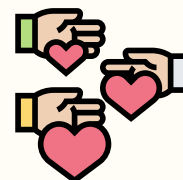

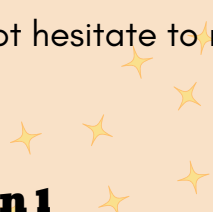
School Reminders
